

Dress Code Guide

Casual

Registration, Refreshments/mixer, Free Time, Walk to Eliminate, Service Fair, Entertainment Assembly

Males:

- Shorts, pants, joggers, jeans
- Appropriate t-shirts, collared shirts, sweatshirts
 - Casual footwear

Females:

- Shorts, skirts, skorts, jeans
- Appropriate t-shirts, sweatshirts
 - Casual footwear

Do Not Wear: Pajamas, short shorts, sweat pants, short skirts or dresses that do not conform to "fingertip rule", shirts that do not cover the midriff, and/or any other revealing clothing.

Spirit Wear

Meet and Greet, Opening Assembly

Males:

- Shorts, pants, joggers, jeans
- Key Club/theme related apparel
 - Casual footwear
 - Circus related costumes

Females:

- Shorts, skirts, skorts, jeans
- Key Club/theme related apparel
 - Casual footwear
 - Circus related costumes

Do Not Wear: Pajamas, short shorts, sweat pants, short skirts or dresses that do not conform to "fingertip rule", shirts/costumes that do not cover the midriff or are cleavage baring/low cut, costumes intended to scare others, and/or any other revealing clothing.

Professional

Caucuses, Workshops, Meet Your LTG, Awards Assembly, House of Delegates

Males:

- Dress shirt, dress pants, jacket/coat
 - Tie/bow tie
 - Dress shoes

Females:

- Business dress or business suit (dress pants or skirt with blouse, or other professional top)
- Dress shoes including appropriate pumps, heels, wedges, or flats.

Do Not Wear: Flip-flops/sandals, bottoms that do not abide by the "Fingertip Rule," shirts that do not cover the midriff, cleavage baring/low cut tops, t-shirts, sneakers/tennis shoes, and/or clothing that does not cover the shoulders.

Formal

Governor's Banquet and Ball

Males:

- Suit with dress shirt or tuxedo
 - Tie/bow tie
 - Dress shoes

Females:

- Business/formal dress (homecoming/prom style)
 Note: Prom style is preferred but not required
- Dress shoes including appropriate pumps, heels, wedges, or flats.

Note: Dress does not have to cover shoulders.

Do Not Wear: Flip-flops/sandals, bottoms that do not abide by the "Fingertip Rule," shirts that do not cover the midriff, cleavage baring/low cut tops, t-shirts, and/or sneakers/tennis shoes.

The "Fingertip Rule" means that no fingertip may extend beyond the hem of a dress or skirt while standing upright. This rule also applies to any slits or cuts in the skirt or dress.
