What worked or went well?:

LTG 25A/Eileen Rivery: The workshops fluidity, the communication on stage, and the general session.

LTG 25B/Noah Shahaf: We sent out invitations for the event. Additionally, we maintained communication frequently with not only each other, but also with our ZAs about plans and ideas or any changes that were going to be made.

LTG 25C/Sara Kvaska: We were organized and had rehearsed what we were going to say on stage, which calmed our nerves. Also, our schedule was on time and ran pretty smoothly along with the workshops.

LTG 26A/Ruben Martinez: The space for the opening/closing sessions was good and we did have enough food for everyone. With the layout of the school, the majority of attendees were able to find the workshops. The meal ticket process worked very well, despite the fact that students crowded in to get lunch.

LTG 26B/Jose Leoncio: I think the most successful about KCKC was having the host club be of assistance. Hialeah Gardens High School was an amazing host! They helped in everything that was asked for. They came the day before to help setup and came early for KCKC to help with final set up.

LTG 26C/Griffin Baker-Royo: The cafeteria was good size of the opening and closing sessions. The host club was helpful in setting up.

Svetlana Nudel: Elaine's relationship and familiarity with host schools ensured we had everything we needed.

Dawn Campbell: The estimation of attendees was accurate. LTG's and volunteers arrived early and were prepared for the members who arrived before registration was opened. The event started and ended as scheduled, despite the audio glitch. The LTG's were very professional and appeared confident.

David Mc Campbell: The presiding LTG's knew their scripts well and seemed to have rehearsed. They looked "professional" and presented a good image of what it means to be on the district board. A script was used for the opening and closing sessions so there were no issues with going over time. The entire event went exactly as scripted and timed. They were prepared for a couple of glitches that occurred (as they always do) and had a backup plan seemingly for anything that did not go exactly as planned. The workshop presenters, for the most part, seemed well prepared and rehearsed. They had educational activities for sessions that ended earlier than the allotted time. This gave the impression of a good use of time and a well-planned workshop. The signage was out early so everyone knew exactly where to go. The team had gone to the facility the day before and checked everything out including the sound system for the general sessions.

What would you do differently?:

LTG 25A/Eileen Rivery: The classroom sizes were too small, only one bathroom was open, and the robbery. More planning ahead of time, run through everything days in advance.

LTG 25B/Noah Shahaf; Having someone to provide additional answers doing the workshops.

LTG 25C/Sara Kvaska: I thought we could have improved on communication on stage and being more prepared for anything wrong that could occur.

LTG 26A/Ruben Martinez: The classrooms for workshops were definitely too small; many people standing. I would recommend using a college campus or a large high school. The division signs were too small, so some individuals were unsure of what to do so they just joined in on the big line (Division 25A). The planning process was very confusing for me since not all of the tasks were delegated clearly. I feel that delegated tasks should be more evenly distributed and sent out to everyone, so that we can all have a chance to help and are aware of what we are each doing. We should have music set up for everyone to get up, dance, and get excited!

LTG 26B/Jose Leoncio: A more productive system for lunch; everyone just ran up and got food.

LTG 26C/Griffin Baker-Royo: More rehearsal of opening and closing scripts. Powerpoint was too short. The classroom was too small for workshops.

Svetlana Nudel: Not enough input from all LTG's. Print copy of scripts for each LTG. Need a larger school.

Dawn Campbell: All LTG's need to be familiar with the scripts and all present for rehearsal. They should greet their clubs during registration. Need to inform the schools that registration is by division. We need classrooms with capacity over 50, and have a separate auditorium and cafeteria.

David Mc Campbell: Do not run your videos from flash drives because the data flow from the drive to the computer may be too slow for a smooth video display. Instead, transfer the videos directly to the computer's hard drive in advance of the meeting. Then, TEST THE VIDEO to be sure it plays correctly BEFORE THE SESSION. If you can do all that the days before your KCKC so that you are using the same computer at KCKC, that is even better, but make sure your computer works with the projector provided.
