Key Club Acronyms

AA/ZA Assistant or Zone Administrator AA's and ZA's along with the DA, District

Administrator, form the Kiwanis Committee on Key Club. AA's are appointed by the DA and serve for a term of one year or until replaced by the DA. AA's can oversee a Zone of Key Club or an operation of Key Club such as the conventions or training.

CKI Circle K International is the collegiate group of the Kiwanis family.

DADistrict Administrator The District Administrator of the Florida District of Key
Club is appointed by the Governor of the Florida District of Kiwanis and approved

by the Kiwanis Board of Trustees. It is usually a multiple year appointment. The DA oversees all functions of the Florida District of Key Club Board. The DA also appoints the members of Kiwanis Committee on Key Club known as Assistant

Administrators (AA).

DCM Divisional Council Meeting is a meeting of the Key Clubs in a division. The Key

Club Lt. Governors are required to host a minimum of 6 meetings during the administrative year. The President and Secretary of each club in the division are

expected to attend.

DCON District Education and Leadership Conference is usually in April in Orlando.

Every Key Club is expected to be represented at the conference.

District A geographical area where all of the Kiwanis Family members are within its

boundaries. In our case, we are all members of the Florida District which

includes Florida and the Cayman Islands.

Division A smaller geographical area that is a part of a District. In Florida, there are 43

Key Club Divisions each led by a Lt. Governor. There are several clubs within a

Division.

FDKC Florida District of Key Club is the high school group of the Kiwanis family in

Florida and the Cayman Islands.

FKF Florida Kiwanis Foundation is the fundraising and grant giving arm of the Florida

Kiwanis Family. We are thankful to the FKW for their financial support of Key

Club Board functions.

FLOF Florida Opportunity Fund One dollar of each Key Club's annual dues goes into

the Florida Opportunity Fund. Clubs or Divisions may request FLOF money

grants. The Key Club District Treasurer is chair of the FLOF committee.

GATC Governor's and Administrator's Training Conference A weekend training

session usually held in early May attended by all the District Administrators and

newly elected Governors.

ICON International Convention The Key Club International Convention is held annually usually late in June or early in July. In 2011, ICON will be in Phoenix, Arizona.

KCKC Key Club Kick-off Conference KCKC is the held in the fall of each year and is designed to train Club officers and members.

KI <u>Kiwanis International</u> Kiwanis International is a global organization of volunteers, dedicated to changing the world, one child and one community at a time. Kiwanis is the parent organization of Key Club.

KCF Kiwanis Children's Fund, formerly known as <u>Kiwanis International</u>

<u>Foundation</u> is the international fund raising and grant offering arm of Kiwanis International.

LTC Leadership Training Conference LTC is a weekend conference where recently elected Key Club Board Members (Lt. Governors and District Officers) receive leadership training.

Lieutenant Governor The LTG is an elected student within the division who provides service, support, and communication to all clubs. He/she coordinates and leads divisional council meetings, divisional rallies and training and provides support to club presidents. The LTG serves as a member of the board of trustees.

MNT Maternal Neonatal Tetanus MNT is the second and largest of the Kiwanis Family worldwide service projects. Its goal is to raise \$110M to help rid the world of MNT, a fast acting killer of mothers and babies in areas of the world that lack proper birthing care. The FDKC committed to raising \$250,000 through Trick or Treat for UNICEF.

OIF Officer Information Form An online form that is completed by the Key Club secretary which lists the contact information for club officers and both advisors.

RLT Regional Lt. Governor Training The training sessions for newly elected Lt.

Governors usually held in April or May in 3 different locations in Florida. The LTG is required to attend one session.

SLP<u>Service Leadership Programs</u> include Kiwanis Kids, Builders Club, Key Club, CKI Aktion Club, Key Leader, Bring Up Grades (BUG) and Terrific Kids.

SZR Spring Zone Rally a meeting held within each Key Club zone, where all Key Clubs come together to learn, get to know each other better, and elect the next Lt.

Governor for each division within that zone.
