

Project Survey

The best projects performed by Key Clubbers have been collected and put into several publications, but this has not always met the need of every locality. The true service club, the one with the most meaningful and productive program, will want to meet the service needs within its own school and community. Therefore, this bulletin suggests conducting a survey to discover the needs in a specific community. The survey itself is good public relations for any club utilizing it.

I. Organization:

It is recommended that the board of directors or the Programs Committee make the decision whether to conduct such a survey and to what limits it should be pursued. Once these details have been decided upon, the board should then prepare a list of those administrative people within the school and community who are aware of needs within their own area of authority. Getting help from the sponsoring Kiwanis club is recommended.

5. Evaluation

- Members should evaluate their learning experience and agencies should evaluate the effectiveness of the members' service.
- Evaluation gives direction for improvement, growth, and change.
- Quality community service should challenge members to educate themselves about the issues surrounding their involvement so they might better understand and work with communities.






